After months of hard work we are able to report that continued bid-writing, lobbying- and the success of the Malta Conference that our immediate future is secure and that a small number of new projects are beginning! We will need to continue to work to secure support for development projects- but of course this has always been a challenge! We expect the climate to remain tough- especially since projects with partner members do not pay ANY of the costs of maintaining the network or of bidding/conference support. It is therefore vital that members associations which have not yet brought their membership up to date do so this month please do so and settle their commitment for 2005-6 by paying their membership fee. #### ❖ **Dutch History Canon- Contested History**

After much debate a History curriculum or 'canon of knowledge' for the Netherlands has been agreed- but only after the commission received a lot of criticism concerning the implications education. Some view this canon as propaganda, other as an essential guideline for the national curriculum. The end result of this contestation is a pretty impressive summary of 3000 years of history on Dutch soil, with a website intended to allow continuing discussion and sharing of knowledge. #### ❖ **Report: Centre for Citizenship and Human Rights Education-Conference: Democracy and Diversity: Principles and Concepts for Educating Citizens in a Global Age, July 2006**

Questions of how to teach to promote democracy and value diversity are at the centre of education policy debates at national, European and international levels. In July 2006 the Centre for Citizenship and Human Rights Education at the University of Leeds hosted the UK and European launch of a key new report *Democracy and Diversity: Principles and Concepts for Educating Citizens in a Global Age*. The Democracy and Diversity report and the conference were designed to encourage teachers and researchers to participate in these debates and develop policy and practice in this field. #### ❖ **Report: Preparatory Seminar on Image of the Muslim World, Strasbourg 9-10 October 2006**

The seminar on "Contact and interaction: the image of the Muslim world in history learning in Europe" took place in the framework of the New Project of the Council of Europe: "The Image of the Other in History Teaching", which is a three year-project that was launched in 2006 by the Steering Committee of Education. This Project sees to "the image of the other" from three different perspectives: within a multicultural society; in the framework of

- ❖ **Report: 'Networking European Citizenship Education', Berlin 11-13 October 2006**  
EUROCLIO Board Member Vassiliki Sakka, funded by her national government, recently took part in the *Networking European Citizenship Education* conference in Berlin on the topic of 'The Politics of Memory in European Migration Societies: Consequences for Citizenship Education' This event was organised by The Federal Agency for Civic Education (Bundeszentrale für politische Bildung) in cooperation with Remembrance and Future Fund (Fonds 'Erinnerung und Zukunft') [Click here](#) to read and discuss the full report.
- ❖ **Report: UN Alliance of Civilisations High-Level Group**  
Since March 2006 Secretariat Staff-member [Jonathan Even-Zohar](#) has been involved in a High-Level Group closed online discussion forum about Inter-civilisational History Education which among its members includes Desmond Tutu and Karen Armstrong. The *UN Alliance of Civilisations* programme is a Spanish-Turkish initiative to explore possibilities to bring the Muslim and the Western world closer together. On the 13<sup>th</sup> of November the group handed over the Final Report to the Secretary-General. The report concludes that a critical review of educational materials is necessary and that: 'Government and religious leaders should work together to establish review panels to ensure that education materials meet guidelines for fairness, accuracy and balance in discussing religious beliefs. Neither materials that denigrate other faiths, nor those accounts of the historical past that ignore the contributions and collective achievements of other cultures and nations should remain unchallenged.'

This Transatlantic Slave Trade related project aims to provide Global Citizenship, educational and capacity building support to young people. - ❖ **Macedonia, United States Institute for Peace has granted EUROCLIO a project: Retelling the History of a New Nation, Development of History Teaching Materials.**  
This is a joint project between historians and teachers from both the Albanian and Macedonian speaking communities in Macedonia. The project aims to develop innovative teaching materials related to the history of Macedonia in the twentieth century, based on collaborative writing, to explore multiperspectivity in retelling the history of a new nation. From 30 November till 3 December the project management team will meet in Skopje to discuss the parameters of the project and to organise the first project seminar on 2 and 3 March 2007. The meeting will further be used to inform the Macedonian Administration, Institutes and key persons about the project. - ❖ **Turkey, New MATRA proposal: Assist the education priority of Turkey towards EU accession by the innovation and internationalization of school history**  
After a fruitful Fact Finding Mission of our executive-director to Turkey, an project has been developed in cooperation with several educational partners in Turkey. This three-year project, if approved by the MATRA department from the Dutch ministry of foreign affairs, aims to contribute to the modernization process of Turkish history education. The broad range of intended projects activities include the organisation of international seminars, experts workshops as well as the development of teaching material. As completion of the project, a national convention is scheduled in the summer 2010. The proposal has been handed in on 1 November, if accepted; the project will take of 1 September 2007. - ❖ **Caucasus, Balkan and Moldova: Development Cooperation (MFS)-proposal not granted.**  
Regrettably, the Dutch Ministries department of Developmental Aid did not grant us the project. The main argument of the Ministry was EUROCLIO did not match the requirements for planning the 25% of co-financing. The MFS proposal aimed to contribute to peace and stability through history and citizenship education in the Balkans, Moldova and the Caucasus. We will continue to search for new opportunities to finance this project, probably on a lesser scale since the next opportunity for applying this grant is only after four years when the current programme has ended. - ❖ **Bulgaria, First management meeting in a new EUROCLIO project**  
The EUROCLIO/Matra Project: *European Dialogues. A Cultural Rainbow for the Future. An inclusive and international approach for the Learning and Teaching of History in Bulgaria* (2006-2009) has started on 1 October 2006. The coordinators met from 25 to 29 October to set the parameters of the project. The project aims to develop, publish, implement and disseminate an innovative teaching resource package, to contribute to the capacity building of key persons in the history education network of Bulgaria and to fortify the EUROCLIO member History Educators' Association of Bulgaria. In order to inform key persons and gain support of the administration the project managers talked with the Deputy Minister Kircho Atanasov, with members of the commission for education of the National Parliament, Vice-Chair Valia Bogdanova and Dr Plamen Slavov, Professor in Plovdiv University. Both the Vice-Dean of the Faculty of History in the University of Sofia, Mrs Miliana Kaimakamova and Head of the Inspectorate of the City promised actively to participate in the project. - ❖ **Bulgaria, Network building training seminar in Bulgaria**  
From 14 to 17 December the EUROCLIO/Matra Project: *European Dialogues. A Cultural Rainbow for the Future. An inclusive and international approach for the Learning and Teaching of History in Bulgaria* will organise in Sofia a Network building training seminar within the Department of Information and In-Service Training of Teachers of the [University St.Kliment Ohridski](#), in Sofia. The seminar aims to present the project among key historians and history educators from different regions in Bulgaria and to identify the level of understanding and application of innovative approaches in school history and record the problems related. The event will further discuss the effectiveness of the changes in the curriculum for the study of modern history, and to identify challenges connected to multicultural diversity in history classroom as well as appropriate persons and institutions for the project activities. EUROCLIO resource persons from England, Greece, Malta and Russia will act as trainers. ❖ **Former Yugoslavia, Great progress made during a EUROCLIO seminar in Dubrovnik, Croatia**

The last development seminar in the EUROCLIO/Matra 2005-2008 project *History in Action – Preparing for the Future, Common approaches for Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia and Serbia* was held from 16- 19 November under the most favourable weather conditions in the beautiful Croatian town Dubrovnik. The Dutch Ambassador Ms Nienke Trooster was present in the opening of the seminar and stressed in her excellent speech the importance of the project for the way history is interpreted and taught in the region. A totally revised version of the Teacher Resource Book on Yugoslavia 1945-1990 was presented and piloted through a series of 14 workshops among a mixed audience of the project team and experienced history educators, historians and educationalist. The reactions on the presented workshops were positive, and the participants inspired the authors to further improve their work. On 18 November almost 50 teachers meeting for the Annual meeting of the Croatian History Teachers' Association were also asked to judge the materials and pilot the ideas among their students. The project team will present two workshops on the position of human rights in Former Yugoslavia during the EUROCLIO Annual Training Conference 2007 in Slovenia. ❖ **Former Yugoslavia, Last common Project Workshop will be held in Novi Sad, Serbia.**

The complete Bosnian, Croatian and Serbian teams of the EUROCLIO Matra-Project *History in Action – Planning for the Future*, will for the last time meet from 22-27 February 2007 for a three day workshop in Novi Sad, Serbia, joined by the EUROCLIO resource persons from Denmark, Macedonia, Slovenia and Switzerland. The group has to fine tune and finalise the materials for the Teacher Resource Book *Ordinary People in an Extraordinary Country, Yugoslavia between East and West, Every Day Life in Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia and Serbia 1945-1990*. After this workshop the materials will be handed over to an editor's team, which has the task to produce the book in the Bosnian, Croatian and Serbian languages before 1 October 2007. In the same time a regional website will be developed, including the textbooks in PDF format plus a variety of supplementary materials.

❖ **Exchange project Turkey-Netherlands**

In addition to the Matra-proposal for Turkey an exchange project is currently under development in cooperation with the European Platform aiming at Turkey and the Netherlands. ❖ **New opportunity for European Cooperation**

The Directorate DG EAC from the European Commission has issued a call for proposals for *Europe for Citizens*. This grant supports civil society organisations acting at European Level such as EUROCLIO. ❖ **DVD: A fiery autumn in the Cold War. Educational DVD on the Hungarian Revolt in 1956**

"1956. It is only eleven years since one of the most destructive wars fought in human history ended. It is already for eleven years since human history began to be overshadowed by the most destructive weapons ever known. These days it seems as if the bitter cold political climate might be warming again. The opposing sides are talking of mutual coexistence, on speakers' platforms and round negotiating tables. Then in the autumn, the world seems to jump out of the new order. Grave crises arise in the middle of a divided Europe and in the Middle East."

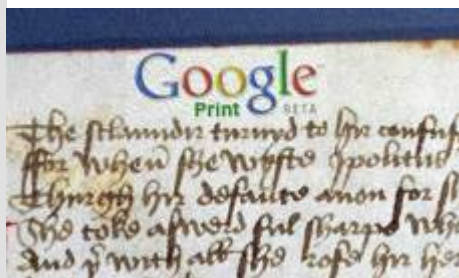
This film offers a gap-filling summary by presenting the history of the 1956 Hungarian Revolution in a world political context. It considers the development of a normality after the Second World War, the characteristics of the Cold War period, and the antecedents of the Hungarian Revolution in Central and Eastern Europe and at home. It uses contemporary documents to present the foreign reactions to the events and failure of the revolution, and

the political considerations and behaviour of the Great Powers. It covers the exodus that followed the revolution and the human cost of the reprisals on those who stayed behind. The visual material in this informative historical documentary has been greatly enriched by the use of clips from recently rediscovered contemporary film reports from American, French, English, German and Russian archives. ### ❖ **BOOK: The challenge of transcultural diversities - Cultural policy and cultural diversity, Council of Europe Publications.**

The economic dynamics of globalisation have intensified not only the transnational flows of cultural goods, media products and information, but also human transnational migration. New forms of mobility have created new kinds of cultural juxtapositions, encounters and exchanges which have resulted in greater and more complex patterns of diversity within the European cultural space. Because these new forms of diversity and complexity are transnational and transcultural in their nature - functioning across national frontiers - they present a challenge for national policy frameworks. The established national mechanisms through which European states have hitherto managed cultural policy diversity and citizenship must now be supported by international or transnational strategies. The Council of Europe, which has for so long championed cultural co-operation as a mechanism for sustaining democracy and equity in cultural exchanges, has a new role to play in the transnational policy landscape. The challenge, at the beginning of the 21st century, must be to develop a democratic transnational and transcultural approach to cultural diversity policy in Europe.
