# History that Connects East and West:

## What happened since the 2015 Summer School?

The 1st Regional 'History That Connects' Summer School 2015 was held in Šipovo, BiH in August 2015 and was a professional development course, enabling transnational exchange of knowledge and experience. Lectures, workshops, discussion groups and study visits stimulated participating history and heritage educators to implement innovative teaching practices in their classroom, museum, site or institute and to work towards a framework for a common approach for dealing with history in the region.

During the Summer School the focus was on cultural heritage and on-site learning, with local workshops about local and global history. After the Summer School, the 8 local partner history teacher associations in the region organized local multiplier events in order to share experiences, new insights, knowledge and methods with local educators.

In total, 338 people participated in the 12 local multiplier events. In general the events were seen as useful and interesting. Participants found it useful for future networking and for strengthening future regional cooperation.

Another outcome of the summer school was a project idea on the Ottoman Legacy in the region and participants from Croatia and Montenegro took it upon themselves to further explore the possibilities of developing the project idea on a regional educational project on the Ottoman Legacy in the region. This will form the basis of a task force that will meet during this year's summer school to plan a project proposal on the shared imperial legacies.

## About this summer school

It will be a capacity-building event providing **transnational transfer of knowledge and experience**. We hope that through lectures, workshops, discussion groups and study visits, participating history and heritage educators will be stimulated to implement innovative teaching practices in their classroom and/or museum/site/institute and to work towards a framework for a common approach for dealing with history. Participants will improve their knowledge of cultures and get acquainted with new educational contents, services, and methods. Participants of similar EUROCLIO events have signalled afterwards that they felt inspired and stimulated to share with colleagues and students what they learnt and contribute to follow-up events and online community building.



## Aims and objectives

- To compare and contrast perspectives on social and cultural local history and heritage.
- To build the capacity of the participants in the teaching and learning of entangled legacies in the region.
- To connect with institutes and cultural entrepreneurs active in the cultural heritage for engagement of young people and school-going children.
- To enable dialogue and cross-community and trans-border networking.
- To learn more about innovative history and heritage teaching resources produced by amongst others EUROCLIO, UNESCO, the Council of Europe.
- To engage in a regional debate on the role of history and heritage education in the promotion of innovating on-site learning.

## Information Note



The Summer School will take place in [Hotel Monte Rosa](#) (Ivanova Korita, Lovćen, 81250 Cetinje, Montenegro) near Mount Lovćen. All activities will take place in and around this hotel. For most of the programme we will use the **Conference Room** (Konferencijska Sala). Except for the on-site learning activities.

**Accommodation** | All participants will stay at the hotel in single or double rooms. You will receive the details of your room type and names of roommates (if you stay in double room) in a separate e-mail.

**Breakfast** is served at the restaurant every morning from **07.30 to 10:00**. **Lunch and dinner** will also be provided in the hotel restaurant except when indicated differently in the programme. Each lunch will include one free drink (non-alcoholic) and each dinner will also include one drink (alcoholic or non-alcoholic). Water will be available during the whole programme. Other drinks can be bought at the Hotel bar in EURO (cash or credit cards).

Most participants are arriving later in the afternoon. In the evening we will start the summer school with an informal dinner at the hotel.

**Registration** for the programme starts 13<sup>th</sup> of July @ Conference Room from 8:30 until 9:00. There all participants are able to sign the registration list, and receive a personal nametag and other conference materials.

During the summer school there is no specific dress code. You should wear what feels comfortable. However weather in Montenegro can change dramatically. On the coast it is advised to wear a **hat and sunglasses**. Once we return to the mountains it can really cool down and it is important to bring a **jacket**. Some parts of the programme (on site learning) are quite active, so we advise you to bring **solid shoes**. Last but not least, since we will be travelling up and down curvy roads it might be wise to bring **motion sickness** tablets.
