

Call for Video Producer

Who were the Victims of the National Socialists?

The Max Mannheimer Study Centre and EuroClio - European Association of History Educators are delighted to launch a call for a video producer for our project *Who were the Victims of the National Socialists?*, supported by the Foundation Remembrance, Responsibility and Future (EVZ). This project focuses on the roots of present-day discrimination by encouraging students to develop their own history projects and research into the victims of the National Socialists in the past. With this pilot, we seek to showcase the power of hands-on, youth-led projects to engage young people of all backgrounds and origins with historical topics in order to develop their civic competencies and character.

Over the course of the coming year, an interdisciplinary and international team of project managers, project advisors, experts and researchers will develop a place-based learning Toolkit that helps students to study the victims of the National Socialists, including victims representing Jewish, Roma and Sinti communities, as well as LGBTIQ+ and political dissenters. Through their own research, students are challenged to think about how legacies of historical injustices can be prevented.

For this project, the Max Mannheimer Study Centre and EuroClio are looking for a Video Producer for the development of:

- A video aiming to promote the project to a wide audience of educators across Europe, with subtitles in English.
- Peer-to-peer videos by students, for students in which students explain how they have created their own local histories for the project.

As a Video Producer, you will:

- Participate in the first international project team meeting scheduled for **17-20 February 2022 in Dachau, Germany**;
- Prepare and develop a concept for the promotional video;
- Take part in preparation visits for the production of the video;
- Shoot the video with young people on location in with students in 6 different countries across Europe;
- Shooting and editing peer-to-peer videos in which students present their projects and explain how the project works for other students;
- Take part in the bi-weekly (1 hour) online management meetings of the project.

What we offer:

We offer a fixed rate of 38.000 EUR (including VAT and use of equipment) and costs for the participation in the international project team meetings, preparatory visits and travel for shooting the video onsite are fully covered, including travel, accommodation and subsistence.

Eligibility criteria

- The ability to travel six times to the European countries of the team members (who are currently being selected).
- Working level of English.

Selection Criteria:

- Motivation to be part of the project (30%)
- Portfolio of video productions (35%)
- Experience with working with young people / students (10%)
- Experience with working on the specific topic of the project (10%)
- Experience with working within educational projects (10%)
- Experience in international projects and with international teams (5%)

How to Apply

Please send your CV, Motivation via and Portfolio to Eugenie Khatschatrian (Project Manager EuroClio) at eugenie@euroclio.eu no later than **6 January 2022 at midnight**. The Portfolio with videos can be submitted via a platform of preference, like WeTransfer. The interviews will take place in the week of **17 January 2022**.

Selection process

The selection will be based on the selection criteria above. The selection procedure will take place in the first two weeks in January, in which we select candidates for the interview based on:

- 1) Eligibility of the candidates;
- 2) Selecting the highest ranking candidates;
- 3) Inviting the top three candidates for an interview.

The interviews will take place in the week of **17 January 2022**. The selection result will be communicated by **24 January 2022**.

Covid-19 Notice

Due to the current development of the Covid-19 pandemic, the first international project meeting to be held in Dachau, Germany from 17 - 20 February 2022 at the Max Mannheimer House, will be subject to local Covid-19 restrictions and measures issued by the national and local authorities in Bavaria. The current Covid-19 measures only allow meetings of more than two people with a valid proof of vaccination or recovery.

EuroClio and the Max Mannheimer Study Centre are closely monitoring current measures and strongly recommend a proof of vaccination when travelling to Dachau for the international project meeting. The format of the international project meeting, will be reviewed one month prior to its date, and based on the local measures and restrictions, it will be considered: to hold the project meeting in-person onsite with the proof validation system that is in place (either RVT or RV Rule), provided that all participants take regular self tests provided by the Max Mannheimer Study Centre; or to organise the meeting in hybrid form with all aforementioned measures in place for the participants that are joining onsite; or to move the meeting fully online.
